WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. We cherish our diversity, offering a safe place of belonging to any who wish to explore their beliefs in an atmosphere promoting discussion, the development of healthy relationships and spiritual growth. We strive to be open to dialogue and shared experiences with people of other faiths. Prayer of Approach

We wonder, O God of Jesus, whether on that festival of Pentecost, there was a sense of a Spirit being in the air. Had the words of Jesus stuck to their ears: "stay here and wait for what our God has promised":

A CLOTHING WITH POWER FROM ON HIGH.

We wonder, O Spirit of truth, whether those gathered had expected wind and fire, and good news delivered in language that made perfect sense, a welcome to the people of many tongues, A PREFECT TRUTH EXPRESSED IN A PERFECT WAY.


