WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. On this Mother's Day Sunday we light a candle in the name of Jesus Christ, a light in the world.



Preface to the Readings:

Apart from Psalm 23 which we will sing, I've departed from the Lectionary Readings set for today, as I wanted to focus more particularly on mothers and mothering or caring in general.


Our first reading from John 19, contains the words attributed to Jesus on the Cross where Jesus speaks to both His Mother and Disciple John linking them for their future as Mother and Son.

Our second reading from Matthew 12, records the occasion when Jesus is told His mother and brothers are waiting outside to speak to Him and Jesus is reported as replying that His mothers and brothers are those who do the will of God His Father.

Here is a broadening of what it means to be a mother or kin of God in Christ.

But before hearing these readings and my reflections arising from them, we sing Psalm 23 set down for today.


The First Lesson: John 19: 25b-27


