WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. We cherish our diversity, offering a safe place of belonging to any who wish to explore their beliefs in an atmosphere promoting discussion, the development of healthy relationships and spiritual growth. We strive to be open to dialogue and shared experiences with people of other faiths. We enjoy worshipping the God made known in Jesus, endeavouring to do so in ways that are relevant to our daily lives, respect the integrity of creation, and make a positive difference to our wider world.

A loop system for hearing aids operates at Knox.

Toilets are available through the door on the city side of the sanctuary.

This is a communion service. The table at Knox is an open one. Members of any church, as well as any who are seeking God sincerely, are welcome to receive communion here.

We take care to use inclusive language in our services. References to God in traditional prayers and hymns may sometimes be gender-specific. As we pray and sing together, you're invited to adapt the words we've chosen.

When we pray the Lord's Prayer, you are welcome to use the language that is most natural to you.

Prayer of Approach

The celebration of the coming of Christ to the world is on the horizon, O God; and it moves us to imagine the inauguration in our days of a brave new world - **TOWARDS THE NEW WORLD.**

Neighbours bang into one another, there are conflicts (only some of them important), wars flare up in various places, law courts are full of unhappy argument.

And in the tension, we dream of a brave new world - TOWARDS THE NEW WORLD.

Through the prophet Isaiah we receive a vision of the coming of justice, unity and peace. It plays with our hope; it moves us to whisper "come, Lord Jesus". In faith, we long to journey **TOWARDS THE NEW WORLD**.

Beginning our Advent season, we confess to the ways we fuel the fire, nurture the hurt, respond to stresses in ways that do no honour to our identity as children of God. We are a people of hot water - wai wera.

So we say

. . . Lord have mercy.

CHRIST HAVE MERCY.

Lord have mercy.

You are forgiven and you are free. THANKS BE TO GOD.

The Theme Prayer:

Putting flesh to the bones of the idea of a new world, O God, your prophet Isaiah presented the image of a mountain of justice, unity and peace. In Isaiah's mind, that mountain presented something utterly compelling, deeply attractive.

BLESS US TO ENGAGE PROPERLY WITH ISAIAH'S VISION, THAT DISUNITY MIGHT BE SWALLOWED UP BY UNITY, INJUSTUCE BY JUSTICE, AND WAR BY PEACE.

The Candle of Justice, Unity and Peace

The Communion



Every week in Aotearoa New Zealand, three families are told the heartbreaking news that their child has cancer. I can't imagine what it would be like to be the parent of one of those children. I am incredibly grateful that the Child Cancer Foundation is there to support those families through their time of need.

My own journey with cancer, beginning with diagnosis of a colorectal tumour in 2022 followed by several rounds of radio and chemotherapy treatment and three surgeries has reminded me that life is both precious and unpredictable. I am very grateful for the support I have received from many friends within the Church community throughout this time. After three years of having my life plans interrupted by medical procedures, I



plan to spend this summer doing something life-affirming for myself and others.

On 11 December I will fly to Kerikeri and ride north to Cape Reinga before turning south to cycle the length of the North Island, realising a dream of riding from Cape Reinga to Bluff which began pre-diagnosis when I cycled the length of the South Island in 2021/22. Seeing this journey as an opportunity to 'give something back', I have applied for and received endorsement from the Child Cancer Foundation.

I am warmly inviting friends, family members, colleagues and acquaintances to support me in this fundraising effort. Whilst sponsorship to the tune of a dollar (or more!) per kilometre travelled (roughly 2000) would be wonderful, a more realistic donation could be the cost of your daily coffee for part or all of the duration of my 27 day journey - or simply whatever contribution you feel you can afford.

Each kilometre I ride this summer will remind me of the journeys that many other families have been and are still on with cancer, and of the support the CCF is able to offer them because of the generosity of so many donors.

I'll be posting regular updates of my progress (which will also be shared on facebook).
